On February 5th and 6th, Brian Oliver, the National Trainer for PGA HOPE, visited Lexington and Louisville to provide training sessions for Kentucky professionals and associates. These sessions aimed to prepare them for upcoming PGA HOPE sessions throughout the year. Each training session spanned a full day, focusing on imparting knowledge about the PGA HOPE Program and its operations.

Each professional and associate learned what PGA HOPE is about, who they serve, how the program works, why we work so hard to improve the program everyday, military culture and how to teach golf to our local Veterans.

In February, we successfully trained 18 professionals and associates statewide, bringing the total number of trained professionals and associates in Kentucky to 68.
