

Tom Cooksey – 2016

Cooksey has served as a rules official in all levels of play, both in Kentucky and across the country since 1976. He was appointed to the Kentucky Golf Association Board of Directors in 1986 and has served the board as Director of Section 9 (Eastern Kentucky), Treasurer, Secretary, Vice-President and President. He also served as President and Honorary President of the Golf House Kentucky and Kentucky Golf Foundation Board of Directors. Cooksey ran the Tri-State Junior Golf Association from 1984-1988, hosting 32 events and serving an average of 400 members per year in Kentucky, West Virginia, and Ohio. Also in 1984, he joined with the American Junior Golf Association and founded the AJGA Bluegrass Junior at Bellefonte Country Club, introducing the concept of a junior-amateur at AJGA events. In 2004, he was appointed to the USGA Junior Championship Committee, which served on for ten years. In 2008, he founded the Eastern Kentucky Junior Golf Association, serving juniors from the 13 easternmost counties in the Commonwealth. He utilized the 501c3 system to raise sponsorships and developed a new revenue sharing program with area high schools. He donated \$5 per participant back to their high school golf program, an amount that totaled more than \$18,000 over five years. He also created a "Just Fore Fun" day for autistic children and their parents. He has received the Digger Smith Award from the AJGA (1997), a lifetime achievement award given for outstanding service to junior golf, the Most Outstanding Golf Official Award from the KHSAA (2005-2006) and the J.W. Janes Award (2007) from the Kentucky Golf Association for outstanding contributions to amateur golf.
