1) How will the funds be utilized?

Funds will be utilized to remove barriers for youth in Southern KY to have proper equipment, course access, tournament fees, and instruction. The First Tee Pine Mountain will partner with KY State Parks to provide course access for tournament play for juniors who otherwise not have the opportunity. Funds will be spent on range, course access, equipment, tournament entry, and instruction. An emphasis will be placed on diversity awareness and special needs and promote PGA initiatives such as Tee It Forward.

2) Please describe the nature and mission of the program.

The Mission of the program is to provide tournament access to juniors who may not have the opportunity to travel across the state for competitive experience or for golf instruction. Adequate equipment assessments will also be provided to offset the hindrance of equipment.

3) How is the program structured (i.e. classes, clinics, tournaments) and what is the length of the program?

The Tournament Series starts April 6 and runs for six weeks with a complement of Competitive Edge preparatory classes beginning March 18 and running on Mondays and Tuesdays for six weeks. The program will conclude with a Competitive Edge Series running in the Fall for four weeks.

4) Where is the program held?

The First Tee Pine Mountain at Wasioto Winds Golf Course (Pine Mountain State Park)

5) How many participants does the program have or how many do you anticipate?

We anticipate 50 – 75 youth to take advantage of the program.

6) Describe the composition and background of participants (age, socio-economic background, gender, golf skill).

The Tournament Series will be offered to all youth regardless of social strata, however an emphasis will be placed upon under-privileged or participants who may not get full tournament/ instruction exposure with cost being a factor.
