1. Please briefly describe the nominee's contributions to the National PGA education program over the past five years (indicate whether participation was on a voluntary or paid basis).

In 2011, I was invited to participate in the PGA of America's Mentoring Conference in Cancun, Mexico. During this conference, the Keynote speaker made not just a challenge, but insisted it as a responsibility for current PGA Professionals to take an active role in mentoring and educating our fellow PGA Professionals. When I returned from this conference, I rejoined the Education Committee and since then I have worked closely with the committee to assist our current PGA Professionals through Education and the formation of the Pro2Pro program. As I returned from the PGA Mentoring Conference in 2011, I formulated a plan for mentoring that I forwarded to the Section President.
