And now, the newly designed PGA.org will replace PGALinks to become the internal site of the Association. With a new public-facing portion of the site demonstrating the value of the PGA Professional, and a new personalized member center, the site is designed to help you grow your career, your business, and the game. The website has been redesigned with a more contemporary format to allow PGA Professionals to customize the content and information to best suit their needs.

To Access the new site: 1. Visit PGA.org and Login with your PGALinks.com username and password What to do first: 1. View the PGA.org Instructional Guide 2. Customize your profile page. Login and click on My Profile to add a new profile photo, update your expertise, and enter your accomplishments. 3. Visit Member Preferences while you are editing your profile to choose whether you prefer content related to Teaching the Game, Managing a Facility, or Advancing the Industry. You've been pre-selected into one of these categories based on your classification, but you can change this setting at any time. Can I still access PGALinks? Yes, both PGA.org and PGALinks.com will be available for a short period of time. At that point, even if you type in PGALinks.com, it will take you to the new PGA.org.
