1) Please describe the nature and mission of the program.

Founded in 1997, The First Tee was a joint initiative of USGA, PGA of America, the PGATour, the LPGA and The Masters. Today, it comprises a network of 185 chapters nationwide, including The First Tee of Greater Cincinnati & Northern Kentucky. All The First Tee chapters are independent non-profits, but all share a mission to help grow great kids and the game of golf. Our program seamlessly integrates important character-development lessons with golf instruction to help students acquire the fundamental life skills, core values and healthy habits that will help them flourish throughout their lives.

2) How is the program structured (i.e. classes, clinics, tournaments); what is the length of the program?

Our core curriculum—The First Tee Life Skills Experience (LSE)—is a tiered program of classes for children 7-18 years old. Students begin at an introductory level (PLAYer or Par, depending on age), and advance to higher skill levels (Birdie, Eagle, Ace) as they meet minimum required age and successfully complete a 'certification' process that tests their golf skills and their understanding of The First Tee life skills lessons. TFT-GCNKY offers four class sessions annually: six-week spring and fall sessions; two three-week summer sessions.

- 3) Where is the program held?
- In Kentucky: The Golf Courses of Kenton County. In Ohio: Reeves GC and Meadow Links & Golf Academy (OH). We are seeking to add a fourth location in 2015.
- 4) How many participants does the program have or how many do you anticipate?

 In 2014, a total of 535 children participated. Our strategic plan goal is to grow to 650 participants in 2015 and to 800 by 2017.
- 5) Describe the composition and background of participants (age, socio-economic background, gender, golf skill).

Our chapter serves children residing in Boone, Campbell and Kenton counties (and two OH counties) from all socio-economic backgrounds. Our gender ratio is 60% boys, 40% girls. We do not track family/HH income, but our participation fees are modest (\$50 per 18-hour class) and full scholarships are readily available on request. No golf skill is needed to begin TFT.

6) How will the funds be utilized?

Funds will be used help underwrite program expenses at our Golf Courses of Kenton County teaching location, including PGA professional golf instruction.
