golf to AREA schools and youth clubs, church
groups, the local boys and girls club of
Maysville as well as the YMCA.

There are various classes and clinics conducted through out the Spring, Summer, & Fall.

Most are beginners who may not otherwise have the opportunity to experience golf. The program reaches both genders as well as participants with limited physical abilities.

The funds are used to help offset the cost of time away from club & other duties as well as to cover cost of volunteers time & effort.
