Biography

Dr. Horace "Bud" S. Humphreys

Dr. Horace Humphreys was born in Memphis, Tennessee on April 27th 1931, moving to Louisville, Kentucky in 1941. Male High School graduate in 1948. Attended the University of Louisville graduating from U of L School of Dentistry 1956 with DMD degree. He served in the USAF Dental Corp until 1959 at which time he moved to Northern Kentucky. He practiced in Erlanger, Kentucky until 2000. When he sold his practice, he partnered with the two purchasing doctors until 2005, retiring in 2007 after 50 years in practice.

Bud became interested in golf while caddying for his dad at about 12 years of age. He won his first Footjoy golf shoes at age 15. In addition, he played on the University of Louisville golf team for 3 years, two of which while attending dental school.

He married Pat Kaiser of Louisville in June of 1955 and they had a great son, Chris, before graduating from dental school in 1956. He served 3 years in the Air Force Dental Corp from 1956 through September 1959, during which time they had two wonderful daughters, Cindy and Vicki.

He played with Miller Barber for 3 years while they were both stationed at Perrin Air Force Base in Texas. While there he played on an exhibition with pro golfer Ted Kroll and Miller.

Dr. Humphreys compiled an illustrious golf career spanning 60 years. Following is a list of awards and achievements:

It is with great honor that I support the nomination of Dr. H.S. "Bud" Humphreys for the induction into the Kentucky Golf Hall of Fame. I have met wonderful people in over 50 years of playing golf, but there is no one I have ever met that loves the game of golf more than Bud Humphreys. Bud is what amateur golf is about. He loved the practice, the competition, the great courses, and the search for the secret to the golf swing. He supported Kentucky Amateur golf by competing at every level and competing at the highest level. Bud dominated Northern Kentucky Golf in the 60's, and his proudest moment may have been his win in the Kentucky State Senior Amateur Championship in 1989. Only Bud's love of family and country surpass his love of golf. I am proud to call him a friend, and he is a large part of my fondest golf memories. The greatest service the Kentucky Golf Hall of Fame could give to the game would be to pass along the competitive spirit that Bud Humphreys has exhibited throughout his career to the next generation of players.
