Dear KY Golf Hall of Fame Committee:

It is my pleasure to nominate, my longtime golf partner and more importantly long time friend, Jimmy Volpenhein for the KY Golf Hall of Fame.

It is without debate that Jimmy has had the greatest amateur golf career of anyone from Northern Kentucky. Jimmy, in my opinion, is the best amateur, other than former US Amateur Champion Mr. John Fischer, in Greater Cincinnati. Jimmy's playing accomplishments, as noted in the attached resume, have been ongoing and consistent for the past 40 years.

The Greater Cincinnati Amateur Championship has long been considered the "Major" championship of amateur golf in Cincinnati. The fields consist of the best players on both sides of the river. The event is traditionally played on the best courses in Greater Cincinnati. The fact Jimmy has won 7 times, over a span of 25 years, when no one else has won more than three times in the 105 year history of the tournament is an accomplishment that will take a very long time to replicate.

Jimmy has had a great deal of success in qualifying for U.S.G.A events having played in 8 US Amateurs and 4 Mid Amateurs. I have no facts to base this on but I would guess only a very few amateur golfers from the State of Kentucky have played in as many U.S.G.A events. Jimmy has also won the U.S. Open local qualifier on two occasions. In 2013 Jimmy qualified for the British Senior Open.


In the State of Kentucky Jimmy has won many events and been close several times in our biggest events. He has runner-up finishes in both the State Amateur and State Open. He won the Kentucky Tournament of Champions twice and the John C. Owens cup three times. He has won the Northern Kentucky Amateur in three different decades and has won more than a dozen club championships at different clubs in Northern Kentucky. Per the University of Kentucky golf team web site Jimmy is one of only five golfers since 1980 to be named First Team All-SEC.

At this point the Kentucky Golf Hall of Fame has only two Northern Kentucky natives as members. Golf in Northern Kentucky does not receive very much media coverage in the two major markets in the state. The results of the local U.S.G.A. qualifying and our other larger golf tournaments can go unnoticed by the rest of the state. Being the best amateur golfer ever from the third largest populated area of the state, in my opinion, is sufficient enough for Jimmy to be a member of the Kentucky Golf Hall of Fame.

When you add in the exceptional amount of success he as had in U.S.G.A. qualifiers along with his record in several of the larger state events plus being one of only a handful of players to be named All Sec while playing for the University of Kentucky, leaves no doubt about Jim Volpenhein being qualified to be a member of the Kentucky Hall of Fame..

Thank you for your time. I appreciate your time and consideration you may give Jimmy. I am very proud to be a Member of the Kentucky Hall of Fame and want to say thanks for your efforts to uphold the standards of the Kentucky Hall of Fame.
