- 1: I've been Sports Director for WLKY-TV for over 30 years. In that time I've tried to promote the game of golf and the local Section and the Association in many ways. I covered the historic U.S. Ryder Cup win, 3 PGA Championships and 2 Senior PGA Championships and a PGA Club Pro Championship at Valhalla. The 3 PGA Championships were also shown live on our tv station through CBS. In connection to that we did a number of specials and surrounding additional coverage on all of the events there.
- 2. Contributions to the game of golf include hosting a charity golf event for over a quarter century at the U of L Club and Valhalla which has generated over \$2 million net for organizations that fight diabetes and cancer.
- 3. Promoting the game includes taking all opportunities possible to put the game and/or highlights on WLKY. I played the game for Ramapo Senior High School in Spring Valley, NY, I played junior college golf at Rockland Community College in Suffern, NY and for a cup of coffee at The University of Tennessee. At my best I was a 3 handicap and while 37 years later I am now a hacker at best, I appreciate the game more than ever and what it espouses in positive virtues. The only game to this day where participants call fouls on themselves and referees play a much more passive role. I have Golf Channel on in the sports department every day all day and play every opportunity I get, which no matter how many of those happen is never enough. Win or lose I would like you all to know that it's a privilege

to have been able to cover the game the way I have here for so long. I did not know when I arrived in 1986 that Valhalla was even here and opening and had no idea it would become what it is today. As I say in my station bio the biggest story I've ever covered is the historic US Ryder Cup win at Valhalla. I was underneath the celebration from the deck afterwards and was covered in champagne in a moment that seemed more like a Disney Movie than reality. It was my dream to play the game professionally but I'm eternally grateful that there was a bigger plan and I instead got this amazing job and experience in my adopted home which included this priceless bonus of getting to cover the game I love in such a uniquely special way.
