We're the experts in making the game of golf fun, and we teach more than just stance and swing; we teach girls valuable life skills like confidence and perseverance.

Each of our 380 Girls Golf sites help prepare girls ages 6 - 17 for a lifetime of enjoyment of the game while also inspiring them to feel confident, build positive self-esteem and live active and healthy lives through The Five E's of Girls Golf.

The young ladies are scheduled for 10 visits. Each visit has a theme, a 30 minute golf lesson and they play golf. I will have three different visiting "mentors" to speak to the girls during the course of the season. Each of the participants is given a privilege card which allows them to play golf for just \$6

For the past several years I have hosted a LPGA Girls Golf Program at World of Golf. The past two years we have been blessed to host, on average, approximately 110 young ladies for the once per week 10 week program. The program is based upon the LPGA's mission statement, which is:

We empower girls through the game of golf and inspire them to dream BIG...

LPGA*USGA Girls Golf (Girls Golf) is the only national junior golf program that specializes in providing girl-friendly environments for juniors to learn the game of golf. We're the experts in making the game of golf fun, and we teach more than just stance and swing; we teach girls valuable life skills like confidence and perseverance.

Each of our 380 Girls Golf sites help prepare girls ages 6 – 17 for a lifetime of enjoyment of the game while also inspiring them to feel confident, build positive self-esteem and live active and healthy lives through <u>The Five E's of Girls Golf.</u>

The five E's of Girls Golf are Enrich, Empower, Engage, Energize and Exercise.

I cannot express how great I think this program is. Being a member of the Positive Coaching Alliance, I can tell you that the LPGA Girls Golf mission statement closely follows the PCA suggestions on how to get a young person interested in a sport and retaining them as a life-long participant of that particular sport.

I have kept the cost of this program as low as I possibly can. The cost for the LPGA Girls Golf at World of Golf for 2017 is just \$55 per young lady. The USGA-LPGA does provide a \$30 per participant grant. I have hosted a couple of fundraisers in the past and will do so again this year.

I have contacted the local girl scouts director asking if their organization would be interested in partnering with World of Golf to promote the LPGA Girls Golf to their members. I mentioned I would be willing to raise \$550 to provide scholarships for 10 young ladies who due to financial difficulties may not be able to participate in the program. I have 12 sets of US Kids Clubs for

those who do not have clubs (these were donated to World of Golf from the Golf Course Architects Association). Below is my contact at the local Girl Scouts headquarters.


