If I am fortunate enough to receive the Gay Brewer Scholarship, I will use the money to help fund my summer and fall golf schedule. Hopefully an opportunity like this would allow me to fulfill my dream of playing college golf at a major university. Few kids can achieve the dream of playing Division I golf without the exposure and recognition gained by playing high level tournaments. Without a grant my opportunity to play is very limited. In addition this money will also remove some of the financial hardship that my parents encounter while trying to allow myself and my siblings the opportunity to play this game at a higher level.

Last year I was fortunate enough to have a few Division I coaches come and watch me play, but due to financial constraints, I have not been able to play tournament golf since last fall. Although I have missed playing this spring due to lack of funds, I continue to practice every day. Both of my parents work two jobs. My dad is a teacher, painter, bus driver, and umpire and my mom is a teacher's aide during the day and cleans a medical office in the evenings. With three kids playing tournament golf, it is very difficult to come up with tournament funds. Entry fees for two players on the bigger tours are in excess of \$400. When you factor in a hotel, gas, and a practice round you are looking at more than \$700 for a weekend of golf. I also have a younger brother that used to play summer golf, but with the cost of entry fees for my sister and me, he has not been able to play.

Golf has given me many opportunities, but without help I cannot reach my goals. Living in a rural area makes it very difficult to compete with the majority of players. . All of my instruction and 98% of tournaments require car rides in excess of one hour which adds even more to our cost. Out of the top player rankings in the state, I am at the bottom of junior golf scoreboard in events played. Without the help of this grant, I can see little opportunity of playing enough events to get recruited. If selected as the recipient of this grant, I promise to work hard and take advantage of the opportunities it

presents. I will use the grant to offset some of the costs of travel, practice, and entry to high level events.

Whitney has defied many odds to become the player that she has. She has overcome medical issues,

geographic issues and financial shortcomings, but has still managed to perform at a high level. She

started playing at a young age, but began having some issues with her knees around age 13. . She was

found to have alignment issues with her legs, but she was fortunate that Shriners could do a surgery to

fix the problem.. She still has the scars and the pins remain in both knees, but luckily the pain has

subsided...

Another huge obstacle for us has been geographically. We may live in the worst part of the state to play

junior golf. She attends the poorest school district in the state of Kentucky, but through the hard work

and determination of a few kids, they were able to lead the school to consecutive Class A State

Championships. Whitney was overall Runner- up in the 2015 All A State Championship and was only one

of two kids to shoot in the 70s that day (the field included three girls that signed D-1) The other girl that

shot in the 70s signed a golf scholarship to the University of Tennessee. . Probably the biggest hindrance

for Whitney has been proximity to instruction and tournament play. Outside of a single AGJA event in

London, Ky., there is not one regional event inside a 1.5 hour drive. Unlike many other players around

the state there is never a day where she can just hop in a car and drive 20 minutes to play a

tournament.. Every tournament requires an overnight stay, and even our instruction requires a drive in

excess of one hour.

I really hope Whitney will be considered for this grant. She is a great kid and an excellent student (4.0

GPA) She has put in thousands of hours of work to become one of the top players, but without the grant

her chances to play are few. My wife and I work hard to provide both of our girls the opportunity play,

but entry fees, travel and lodging has made it almost impossible to fund it. We even have to pay our

own entry for high school events. Please consider her for the grant. She puts in the time and through

opportunity she might take her game to another level.
