I believe my teaching performance has been credible and functional. I work with aspiring tour professionals, collegiate players, and accomplished juniors, as well as members and guests at the University of Louisville Golf Club.

I have built the Cardinal Junior Golf Academy from the ground up. Since my first month at ULGC, I have offered an Academy program for up and coming junior golfers every month. Using the indoor-to-outdoor Musselman Center in the winter months is a luxury that most do not have. I have hosted and taught over 150 unique junior golfers since June 2016 with an average of 25 juniors involved in various programs each month. I do all the teaching myself to make sure the quality of the instruction is uniform. No one to blame but me.

I wrote a short submission to Golf Digest for their "How He Hit That" weekly feature after Jhonatton Vegas won in July 2017. 3. Please describe the nominee's overall performance in teaching at the facility, Section and National level.

Before I go into my assessment of my teaching abilities I would like to say that what I am about to do makes me very uncomfortable. I do not like to brag or post things on social media when I have success with a student. I leave that up to them if they want to tell others how much I helped them or how much success they are having because I work with them. I do what I do to make a difference, not to make a bunch of money or garner notoriety. Having said that, I will go into my assessment of my performance as a teacher.

I feel comfortable teaching anyone at any level. They could be a raw beginner or one of the best players in the world. I believe my understanding of biomechanics, physics, motor learning, brain science, etc has helped me wade through what doesn't work with a student. It gives me the opportunity to help them in a much faster way. I am so grateful that I have spent the last 8-10 years traveling the country, spending all of the money that I had at any given one time so that I could learn from the smartest and brightest minds in several areas of expertise. Some were scientists, some were golf teachers, and some were world class players.

The education and experiences I have acquired over the years has afforded me the ability to "skin a cat" multiple ways, but get the same outcome. I had players and still teach players that are trying to make a living playing golf. My approach to each of them is often times very different. Fortunately, many of them have had success and continue to get better. As a teacher, you have to know that what works for one player, may not work for another. I believe and subscribe to this analogy: A teacher should be like a doctor. The doctor, if he's any good, should know that the medicine he gives to one patient could potentially make another patient very sick or even kill them. You have to know who to give what to and how much. This analogy guides me on the lesson tee with all of my students and has helped my overall performance immensely.

4. Please briefly describe any unusual, innovative or special teaching programs the nominee has initiated or implemented. I implemented a Long Term Athletic Development program for out junior golfers at Owl Creek Country Club. This program was designed to aid in their physical literacy and overall performance, not just in golf but in all physical activities. I learned many of these concepts while attending a TPI Junior Coach Level 2 certification. In a nutshell, the program consists of physical activities such as jumping, throwing, catching, climbing, etc. They learn how to use their bodies for physical activities, preparing them for many sports and life. This program ran for approximately 4 years and was attended by several juniors.

5. Please list any instructional articles, videos and/or publications the nominee has written or contributed to. I was fortunate to be one of the

presenters at a Teaching Summit held at Keene Run (February 2016.) The title of my one-hour presentation was: Why Players Do What They Do. During my presentation, I discussed with the attendees what I have learned over the years while teaching and coaching my students.

#### 6. Please list the names of outstanding golfers the nominee has instructed.

<u>Lilly Young</u> Won the Big I tournament held at Oxmoor CC in 2017. She attended Northern Kentucky University in the fall and is currently a nationally ranked freshman.

<u>Luke McClellan</u> is a mini tour player I teach that lives in South Carolina. He won a mini tour event in his home state earlier this year. He advanced to sectional qualifying for the US Open and also advanced to the second stage of Web.com qualifying school.

<u>Daniel Iceman</u> was a member of the University of Louisville golf team. He shot -10 to get his way into a playoff for the 2016 Kentucky Open. He has qualified and won the Kentucky PGA assistants championship in 2015 & 2016, where he advanced to the national championship finishing top 20. Daniel also Monday qualified into a Mackenzie Tour event (PGA Tour Canada) in 2016. He finished 1<sup>st</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> out of 3 PGA Winter Series events in Port St. Lucie, Florida in 2017 as well as some wins and top finishes in Kentucky Section Tournaments.

<u>Chris Malec</u> was a member of the University of Louisville golf team. He finished T6 in the first stage of Web.com Tour qualifying school in 2015 to advance to second stage. Attended Web.com Tour qualifying school in 2016 as well.

<u>Brandon Brown</u> was a member of the Eastern Kentucky golf team. He has won several Hooters Tour events, Monday qualified into Web.com events, qualified for two PGA Tour events, qualified and played in the 2013 US Open at Merion.

<u>Yarik Merkulov</u> was a member of the Duke University golf team. He Monday qualified for a Mackenzie Tour event in 2016.

Please describe the nominee's involvement in growing the game of golf through juniors, women, minorities, seniors and the disabled. While working at Owl Creek Country Club (2008-2015), I conducted several Long Term Athletic Development camps to promote physical literacy for junior golfers. I conducted several women's clinics while I was there as well. This year I was also lucky enough to be a PGA Junior League coach at Clear Creek Golf Course in Shelbyville, Kentucky. We started with 26 kids and I am proud to say that all of them are still playing golf. In 2017, I was a PGA Junior League coach for the Weissinger Hills team. We had a great year and won most of our matches. It's so great to see how much participation PGA Junior League is generating for the game of golf. At our facility, we have seen junior golf thrive more than ever due to this initiative.

3. Please describe the nominee's overall performance in teaching at the facility, Section and National level.

As an employee at Traditions Golf Club, I teach 90% of my lessons individually. In 2017, I gave over 1000 individual lessons. This number is one-on-one instructions not golf clinics. Each lesson is one hour. The other 10% of my time is giving free swing analysis to new members at Traditions. With a core base of my lessons living in Cincinnati Ohio, I saw a decrease in this base of my individual instruction by 20%. This decrease was largely due to the construction/closing of the Brent Spence Bridge from July to October.

Teaching is a passion for me. There is not one way to teach a player. I try to understand what the player wants to achieve. Being truthful, realistic and creative helps me to be a better communicator with that person. What fits one player does not fit another. I try to help a player implement changes under good fundamentals of the golf swing.

And as we all know, there is more to swinging to playing golf. Playing lessons have become an essential part to my teaching. I need to see how my students are achieving/implementing their goals on the course. Depending on the student's time and my schedule, I want to see how the student is thinking around the golf course.

I liked to believe that I have all the answers in golf instruction, but I know better. Because of my many years in the golf industry, I have kept in contact with many instructors in the country. If I feel I need some help in finding a way to communicate a change or to get another drill, I pick up the phone or email that instructor for help.

My teaching performance on the sectional and national levels are almost difficult to achieve due to time issues. I work an average of 55 hours a week with employment obligations to Traditions. As I will travel to work with elite players and, sometimes tour players, this is done on my own time and expense.

- 5. Please list any instructional articles, videos and/or publications the nominee has written or contributed to. I produced a video for our Clubster app for our membership at Traditions. The video was on timing and sequencing of the swing by using something as simple as a towel.

3. Please describe the nominee's overall performance in teaching at the facility, Section and National level.

With over fifteen years of teaching at Man O'War Golf I have been involved with all levels of instruction. My main focus lately has been on junior golfers who are active in tournaments. These juniors play on the local, regional and national level. Many of these kids are working hard to be able to play at the next level. During the season, I conduct the ladies clinics. Get GOLF Ready. A big improvement to my teaching in 2017 has been using boditrak for my students. This shows them the proper balance in their feet as well as the correct sequencing pressure shift in the swing. It is very eye opening to the students.

4. Please briefly describe any unusual, innovative or special teaching programs the nominee has initiated or implemented.

Since 2009, I have conducted the UK class for golf. The class allows the UK student the opportunity to learn golf and recognize the importance of golf and how it will help them in the future. Over two hundred and fifty kids have taken the class.

5. Please list any instructional articles, videos and/or publications the nominee has written or contributed to.

Over the past few years Man O' War and myself have released videos on You Tube covering different subjects of the golf swing.

I spend time advising juniors and their parents on tournaments and the level of competition appropriate for that child. This leads to the parents wanting to know what chances their child have in playing college golf. To help answer these questions, I have developed a handbook that helps parents and students know the necessary steps to take when thinking about playing at the next level.

My first successful player is Keith Ohr. Recently, several of my players have found success in winning tournaments. Hannahbeth Owens has won the Marion Miley and her first college tournament in 2017. Bailey Hubbard won a number of high school events, as well as the past Miss Ky Golf award, which has lead to her signing with EKU. MacKenize Neal has won high school events as well as local junior events. She is a three All state Team member. Rebekah Upchurch was a Hurricane junior tour winner in 2017. So many of my juniors have reached their goal of playing college golf.

3. Please describe the nominee's overall performance in teaching at the facility, Section and National level.

I began my teaching career in 2012 as an independent contractor with no client base and space on the practice tee to teach. In 6 years as a golf instructor, I founded the Stephens Golf Academy, which annually conducts over 3000 private golf lessons as well as group instruction programs, PGA Junior League, and USGA-LPGA Girls Golf programs. I also designed, funded, and oversaw the construction of two state of the art teaching buildings at our academy. From January 1, 2015 to today (December 14, 2017), I've taught 4,180 private golf lessons to golfers of all ages and abilities. The number of golf lessons taught at my facility (The Golf Ranch in Burlington, KY) has tripled since our academy took over teaching operations in 2015.

During my 6 years as a golf instructor, I've attended several national teaching seminars and summits and have received advanced teaching certifications from US Kids Golf, Trackman, K-Vest, and SAM Puttlab, among others. In that time I've also completed the Professional Golf Management Program and am scheduled to be elected to PGA membership on January 3, 2018. I also served as the Assistant Men's Golf coach for the University of Cincinnati from 2012-2015, where the team moved from outside the top 250 in the Golfstat national rankings to 89<sup>th</sup> in 2015.

I'm fortunate enough to specialize in the teaching of competitive junior and college golfers, as well as professional golfers ranging from mini tour to PGA/Champions Tour. Currently I teach 6 players on the Northern Kentucky University Men's golf team, as well players at Eastern Kentucky University, the University of Cincinnati, Xavier University, and Thomas More College. However, some of my biggest success stories have been recreational golfers that have dropped their handicaps 10 strokes during our time together.

4. Please briefly describe any unusual, innovative or special teaching programs the nominee has initiated or implemented.

In 2015, I implemented the "Junior Elite" program for aspiring college golfers. The goal of the program was to provide a team-like atmosphere for hard working and passionate junior golfers who desire to play at the next level. The program consists of private lessons, on course lessons, tournament scheduling, physical fitness, and college recruiting assistance. The program is limited to 8 golfers and consists of players ages 12-18. 3 graduates of the program have gone on to play Division 1 college golf and 1 player entered Eastern Kentucky University's PGM program as recently passed his PAT. Tragically, one of my junior elite members lost their father to suicide in November. He is currently committed to play golf at Thomas More College. His family can no longer afford golf instruction, but I have committed to finish our work together and have donated my time to him for the rest of his high school career.



3. Please describe the nominee's overall performance in teaching at the facility, Section and National level.

As Director of Player Development at The Golf Academy @ Persimmon Ridge, my responsibilities include introducing new golfers to the game, continuing to help established golfers improve, and always looking for new ways to make the game easier for our players. In the Kentucky Section, I strive to be a positive role model by conducting myself in a professional manner, being a constant face at educational opportunities, and encouraging assistants, apprentices, and PGM students to reach out for learning opportunities.

Thanks to Persimmon Ridge and our year old training facility, I have the ability to teach 12 months a year. In the summer, we stay busy with 3-5 week-long PGA Junior Golf Camps where we host up to 20 juniors a week for half/full day instruction. In 2016 & 2017 we coached St. Patrick's MS team which included more than 90 players/year, hosted a MS developmental weekly clinic for more than 40 players, fielded 3 PGA Junior League Teams, conducted weekly Saturday Junior clinics at Persimmon Ridge and King Louie's Sports Complex, worked with about a dozen college athletes, and have grown to nearly 100 middle school and high school golfers that we see weekly for group training and individual instruction.

I am always looking for ways to improve and be the best possible coach for our players. To me, this includes both growth and learning in the field of golf and also personal growth. On the side of golf, I have traveled to New Jersey to achieve a certification in BioSwing Dynamics under the tutelage of Mike Adams, spent a weekend in Richmond, VA shadowing the junior golf program at Independence Golf Club, one that sees over 3,000 juniors each year, gone through multiple online certification programs, completed the Vision 54 "Be A Player" program, and am enrolled in Lynn and Pia's Coaching for the Future training in early February. Personally, the greatest personal challenge I have found is Ryan Moran's 10 Day Challenge. Completing this has led to my desire to continue to learn more about myself and how I can best serve others. I have found that audiobooks and podcasts from mental coaches/life

strategists like Tim Ferris, Tony Robbins, Dr. Bhrett McCabe, Dr. Robb Bell, and many more have improved my coaching as much as, if not more than, golf specific learning.

Every Spring, I volunteer at the Louisville Golf Expo PGA Free Lesson booth and speaks on the main stage as a keynote speaker. I continue to reach out to fellow PGA Professionals for guidance and education in order to provide my students the best possible product I can offer.

4. Please briefly describe any unusual, innovative or special teaching programs the nominee has initiated or implemented.

I have implemented the following programs at Persimmon Ridge:

- The Littlest Golfer (Juniors ages 3-5)
- Weekly Junior Clinics (ages 6-13)
- MS/HS Player Program
- Vision 54 Training (4 hour clinic)
- 1-week long Junior Camps
- Supervised Practice- 1 ½ hours a week where each student would receive Colby's "Perfect Practice" program and work together in a group practice session.
- Course Management Clinics
- · AimPoint Green Reading Clinics
- Short Game Golf Schools
- TrackMan yardage gapping sessions- 1-2 hours of hitting balls on TrackMan with each club. Clubs would be altered/fit as needed to create the desired carry yardages for each club.
- SAM Putt Lab sessions- Students would go through an initial measurement and extended training using SAM Putt Lab.

By far the most innovative and effective program we have created is our Committed/Elite program which includes weekly group practices and individual training. Due to its nature as a yearlong program, we are able to tailor the practice schedule to fit the time of year. In the off season (October-January) we focus on club head speed, body pivots, drivers, and TrackMan education. Our juniors have averaged an increase of 2 mph/month utilizing our speed training routine. As we get closer to the season, we transition into wedges and putting as well as starting to focus on course management techniques and Vision 54 training. Once back outside, we get into tournament/practice routines, tons of short game, on course training, and dispersions. Once in tournament season, the foundation is set and our focus shifts to making sure all of our players are tournament ready while making minor adjustments to fundamentals as needed but staying focused on short

game, course management, process, and feel. In 2017 players from this program combined for more than 60 tournament wins and over 100 top 5 finishes.

In the summer of 2017 I began using dispersions to help our high school and college players manage their tee shots for tournament rounds. I would use TrackMan to get a players dispersions and carry distances and create a course map for them using Google Earth. This would give players a start line and club selection based on their dispersions and tendencies for each tee shot they would play. In the Fall of 2017, I made course maps for players at St. Xavier, Trinity, KCD, Floyd Centeral, University of Kentucky, Indiana University, Dayton, Cincinnati, Moorhead State, Ball State and Bellarmine. Players using the course maps averaged 2-3 more fairways a round and more importantly dropped their scoring average by 1-2 strokes a round. Cooper Musselman used the course maps for this entire season at UK including an individual win at Crooked Stick which propelled him to #33 in the country.

I have written semi-monthly articles for Southern Gaming Magazine of Indiana as well as shooting 3-5 instructional videos a year with Inside Kentucky Golf. In the Spring of 2015, I published "Learn to Play Golf: A quick and easy guide, from tee to green" on Amazon Kindle.

7. Please describe the nominee's involvement in growing the game of golf through juniors, women, minorities, seniors and the disabled.

I have served on the Player Development Committee for 4 years including chairing the committee for 2 years. The following are programs that we have implemented to continue to grow the game.

Get Golf Ready/Beginning Ladies Clinics- Our GGR program has transformed into weekly beginning ladies clinics for those that wanted to continue playing after the 5 week program.

Golf in Schools- Last Winter/Spring, I visited 6 different elementary schools with his Golf in Schools Program. He visited each school for 1-2 weeks with the attempt of seeing every student (K-6<sup>th</sup> grade) at least once. Since its inception Colby has reached over 3,000 kids.

Drive, Chip, and Putt- To coincide with the national program, I started a DCP Training series at Persimmon Ridge to help prepare his juniors for their competition. In its second year, the program reached over 20 juniors. 8 juniors made it through the local qualifying stage.

PGA Junior League Golf- In its third season at Persimmon Ridge, PGA JLG boasted 56 participants. Colby was able to create 3 travel teams and 1 practice team out of the juniors that participated. The practice team consisted of 8-10 juniors that were new to the game. They would practice with the travel teams weekly and competed in their own matches at the end of the season. The season kicked off with a very successful "Fun Night" which included SNAG Baseball, BirdieBall Golf (with the inflatables of course!) It concluded with much of the same: inflatables, SNAG Baseball, and an awards banquet.

Junior Camps- In 2017 Colby directed the following Junior Camps:

PGA Junior Golf Camps- 3 camps conducted reaching 50 juniors. Camps ran Monday-Friday and juniors had the choice to participate in either a half day or full day camp.

Weekly Junior Camps- We conduct weekly one-day junior camps year round. These camps totaled over 200 students taught.

EWGA Clinics- In 2017, Colby offered 2x 5-week clinic series' for the EWGA with a total of 12 women participants.

Louisville Golf Expo- I volunteer yearly at the KPGA Free Lesson booth at the Spring Golf Expo as well as speak on the main stage.

St. Patrick Middle School Team- In 2016 & 2017, we took over the Middle School team at St. Patrick School. Thea team consisted of 150 juniors that would meet twice a week during the season. I coordinated with 6-8 other coaches working on athletic development, short game skills, on course learning, full swing, and of course fun games weekly.

The Littlest Golfer- The Littlest golfer consisted of a group of golfers ages 3-5. The program utilized the book "Let's Play Golf" by Nicole Weller and The Littlest Golfer sets were provided to those that did not have their own clubs. I am a certified "Little Golf Train Conductor" which specialized in working with kids in this age range.

Juvenile Detention Center- I began visiting a local juvenile detention center with SNAG equipment in the winter of 2016. The goal is to provide an incentive for the kids to set goals and stay focused on getting their work done. I print out a goals sheet for each participant. In order to get to do golf the next week, they had to come up with a list of goals as well as steps to achieve them. They also needed to get all of their work done and be on good behavior. 100% of the juniors still at the facility the following weeks succeeded in both of these areas.

Semper Fi- In 2017 I spent 2 days working with wounded veterans through a golf school offered to them at U of L Golf Club. I have also been through the PGA Hope certification.

3. Please describe the nominee's overall performance in teaching at the facility, Section and National level.

My teaching career began in 2005 at Man O' War Golf working with their junior golf program. I became a full time instructor in 2008 and in 2010 became their Junior Golf Director. Although my main focus was on junior golf, I was instructing golfers of all ages and skill levels both individually and in group lessons. At my time at Man O' War Golf we were one of the first facilities to utilize the Titleist Performance Institute and the Get Golf Ready Program from the PGA.

In 2011 I left Man O' War to help Larry Ward build the High Performance Golf Academy at Keene Trace Golf Club where I became co-owner in 2012. In 2016 alone I will have given over 1200 hours of golf instruction. The rest of my time has been spent doing research, writing, or whatever else I can think of to become a better golf instructor.

At the High Performance Golf Academy I'm able to work with elite players as well as beginner golfers. After 11 total years of teaching I am starting to see some of my players that I began working with when they were very young start to get scholarship offers to play golf in college.

In 2015 we became one of the first Golf Channel Academies in the country and 1 of only 2 in the state of Kentucky. With the name recognition of NBC and the Golf Channel we are able to reach more potential golfers than ever before.

Another component to my instruction is that I am currently a Titleist, Ping, and True Temper certified club fitter and have conducted over 1,350 club fittings in my career. I believe it is very valuable as an instructor to be knowledgeable about equipment and club fitting since I know my student's swings and would be best suited to fit them.

I am currently the only K-Vest Level 2 certified instructor in the section. My other certifications include SeeMore Putting Institute Certified Instructor, Eyeline Golf Certified Instructor, and Putting Zone Certified Instructor. In 2016 I became a Level 2 Sam Putt Lab Certified Instructor.

As a way to become more nationally known, I joined the SwingFix network of golf instructors in 2011. Swingfix is an online lesson platform that allows anyone to upload a golf swing, choose an instructor, and take a lesson. There are 43 instructors to choose from and I am currently the only one from the state of Kentucky. I have given online lessons to over 150 players during my time with SwingFix.

In 2014 I joined another online network of instructors called Athlete Nation, which provides a platform for branded online lessons. In 2014 and 2015 I have given over 200 online lessons to players from all over the country and am one of only two instructors from the state of Kentucky.

I was Head Golf Coach for the boys and girls golf teams at Sayre High School in Lexington, KY for 3 seasons.

I am now the Head Coach for the women's golf team at Transylvania University. In my first season we had 2 players finish 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> in the

HCAC conference Championship. In my second season we won the HCAC conference championship and I was named the HCAC Coach of the Year.

In 2015 and 2017 Golf Digest Magazine recognized me as one of the top teachers in the state of Kentucky. In 2016 I was named as a Top Young Teacher in America by Golf Digest.

4. Please briefly describe any unusual, innovative or special teaching programs the nominee has initiated or implemented.

To make my instruction more affordable and available, I offer coaching packages that can be paid on a monthly fee. These packages allow me to charge students significantly less per lesson so I can increase the frequency I can work with them.

I use an online coaching platform called Edufii to stay in contact with my students after the lesson is over. I can share lesson notes, swing videos, tips, and other resources with them at anytime. It also allows me to send mass message broadcast to all or segments of my client base for improved communication.

In 2014 I began using Shot By Shot which is an online stat tracking service that analyzes rounds of golf in ways similar to what the PGA Tour does to measure Strokes Gained. This has given me more insight into what my players are going through and made our time together more efficient by spending time working on problem areas.

Edufii and Shot By Shot are included in all of my coaching packages.

A big part of my summer programs involves getting to junior tour events and observing them in action. This has also become a great way for me to talk to parents and help them understand what to expect from their junior golfer.

With the use of technology like a high-speed camera, iPad, and a collection of training aids, my golf instruction is portable. I have visited schools, and several golf teams at their facilities throughout the Kentucky Section bringing my instruction to them.

Using video software, Trackman launch monitor technology, and both standard and high definition cameras, I feel that I can offer my students

the very best lesson experience possible. Having an indoor/outdoor facility also allows me to continue my instruction during the winter months.

The use of 3D motion technology from K-Vest has been the biggest improvement to my instruction in my career. Having that technology readily available for all of my students has given me the ability to help them in ways I never thought possible. Combining what I learn from K-Vest and the information I receive from TPI evaluations, I feel I can help my students more than ever.

In 2015 I added Sam Putt Lab to my offerings and have already conducted over 100 sessions. Adding this new technology is also allowing me to be more thorough in putter fitting as well as helping me do more research to improve how I teach putting. I am currently a Level 3 Sam Putt Lab Certified Instructor.

In 2012 I began implementing the PGA Sports Academy into the summer camp program at Keene Trace Golf Club. We have seen steady growth each year in our junior camp program.

5. Please list any instructional articles, videos and/or publications the nominee has written or contributed to.

From 2012 - 2014 I was a weekly contributor to the Golf Channel's website and their Golf Instruction Blog. At the conclusion of each week's PGA Tour Event, I wrote an instruction article connected to how the winner performed.

I've also had instruction articles published in LexScene Magazine and the Danville Advocate Messenger. I've also contributed articles and videos to the Kentucky Golf Insider Newsletter.

My golf instruction articles have also been published on the Golf Channel's Swing Fix Instruction Blog, as well as SwingFix's Instruction Blog.

In addition to writing these articles I also manage my own golf instruction blog, <a href="http://tyrusyork.com">http://tyrusyork.com</a>. I not only write about golf instruction, but PGA Tour news, results in college and high school golf, and anything else pertaining to the world of golf. I also incorporate social media to increase exposure for my website and articles.

In the summer of 2013 our facility at Keene Trace Golf Club was featured on Inside Kentucky Golf. I also filmed a golf tip for the show that has been aired several times.

I have also utilized YouTube and Periscope to publish other golf tip videos.

In 2016 I began contributing instruction articles to The Golf Warehouse and their email marketing campaigns that are sent to millions of golfers around the world.

7. Please describe the nominee's involvement in growing the game of golf through juniors, women, minorities, seniors and the disabled.

Junior golf has been a passion of mine from the beginning of my career. In our programs at Man O' War Golf I've had the opportunity to work with hundreds of different junior golfers. Currently I am working to grow the game at our academy by incorporating the PGA Sports Academy into our junior golf camps.

I've offered Get Golf Ready and ladies only clinics and have also volunteered time working with the Special Olympics in the Lexington area.

In 2014 I began serving on the Player Development committee in the Kentucky Section.

I have volunteered to teach golf in PE class at Sayre School during the spring. I've been able to work with around 75 kids in 3 different grades. In the past I have volunteered to teach golf in PE classes at other local public schools in Lexington.
