1) Please describe the nature and mission of the program.

The First Tee Pine Mountain offers "Competitive Edge" to junior golfers ages 12-18 in Southeast Kentucky to grow the game of golf. It is offered at Pine Mountain State Resort Park to provide accessible golf to juniors who may otherwise not have an opportunity. Our mission is to help these young golfers develop to the extent that they can compete on local high school teams, South East Kentucky Junior Golf Tour, and Kentucky Junior PGA. The participants will receive individual instruction on Mondays and compete on Tuesdays. They will also receive training on goal-setting, and the nine core values of The First Tee curriculum.

2) How is the program structured (i.e. classes, clinics, tournaments); what is the length of the

program?
Mondays are practice days with individual and group golf instruction provided by a PGA Member and college golfers. On Tuesdays, the participants will compete in two divisions: 12-15 and 16 & up. The competition is set on shorter yardages for the younger divisions and more of tournament yardage for the older participants. Competition varies with match play, stroke play, and team events. Rules sessions are provided along with Individual Goal Sessions to help every junior progress and stay in the game. The program lasts for 6 weeks in the spring and 6 weeks in the fall with roughly 50 participants getting exposure to the game in a rural area.

- 4) How many participants does the program have or how many do you anticipate?

 Competitive Edge routinely brings 50 new golfers to the game each season.

 We have 10 area schools represented.
- 5) Describe the composition and background of participants (age, socio-economic background, gender, golf skill).

Ages 12-18 / Roughly 90 % of our participants come from home situations who cannot afford golf, equipment, or private lessons. We expect to have 40% girls based upon past seasons and our skill ranges from beginner to 2 handicap.

Our Professional staff runs this program on their days off and this will compensate the Professional and offset some of the administrative cost for The First Tee.
