Whether it is in school, sports, or other activities like 4-H, I am always expected to put in my best effort, regardless of any hardships or financial burdens. I was born into unfortunate circumstances with my mother addicted to heroin, so myself and my four sisters had to endure many obstacles that came from her addiction. I was taken from her when I was four and custody was granted to my grandparents. Because of my grandparent's support. I have never been allowed to give up and am expected to take every opportunity I'm given. As a child, I didn't understand why they pushed me the way they did, but I've come to realize their efforts were an attempt to help me be as successful as possible. I am thankful for their lessons, motivation, and my circumstances because it has helped to shape me into the athlete and person I am today. I believe I deserve the Justin Thomas Fund Grant because I would value and wholeheartedly take advantage of this financial opportunity to further my academic and athletic career. This grant, simply put, is a very important avenue for stepping up my competition level from local to state and even national opportunities.

I began my golf journey only two years ago, the summer before my sophomore year of high school. I was very excited at the opportunity to learn a new skill and make new friends. My first activity was a putt-a-thon, where we had to make 100 putts from five feet for pledges. I only made twenty-three, but this experience was the first spark that would soon become a fire of passion for the game of golf. I learned as much as I could in my first season, and I fell in love. I soon got a job working at Tanglewood Golf Course, which was just down the road from my house. I made \$7.50 an hour washing carts and taking out the trash, then spent any time I wasn't busy working on my game. On days where I didn't have a ride, I would walk the mile to and from the course, never wanting to miss the opportunity to get better. It didn't matter to me that

my clubs were old and used, or that I didn't have all the new technology- all that mattered to me in this moment was that I was playing the game I loved, and I was addicted.

My grandparents quickly realized how committed I had become. They respected my dedication and despite our stressful financial situation, bought me a brand-new set of clubs. This fueled the fire and motivated me incredibly, because with the new clubs alone, I saw a new player emerge. It was then I knew that if I worked hard enough, someday, if it took ten months or even ten years, I could be something.

After shooting a 95 at regionals in September, I decided to get lessons to step up my game. As soon as I could drive, I got another job serving tables so that I can afford lessons at The Golf Academy at Persimmon Ridge. My grandparents wanted to support me as much as possible, but around this time my mom had an unplanned baby and checked herself into rehab. I never imagined I'd be able to afford such great teachers with my circumstances, but they allowed me to negotiate a lower payment. This way I am able pay for the lessons myself. The time I spend and instruction I receive at this facility is invaluable, and I have never taken for granted the opportunities it has given me. Even though almost all my money is spent on golf, it is worth it when I see myself improving. I have learned so much about myself as a golfer and athlete through my lessons. I try my hardest to practice at least two hours every day in order to get better and someday be recruited to play on a college team. This is where I am now. Most of my paychecks go towards registering for tournaments on the KY Jr PGA, and The Hurricane Junior Golf Tour so that I can get as much experience as possible and hopefully improve greatly before my senior season. I have high aspirations of playing on a college team, so I need to give myself as many regional, state, and national opportunities as possible. I still have a very long way to go with my golf game, but I am still addicted, and the fire still burns bright.

My name is Mary Ann Ellis and my husband's name is Michael Ellis. We are the grandparents of Jenaleigh Ellis. Our family moved from Meridian, Mississippi to Kentucky after we came to the realization that our hometown had a school system that was failing its students. My husband had the opportunity to go into business with my brother-in-law and as a result, they opened a moving company in Louisville. We settled in Spencer County and have been beyond pleased with the education provided to Jenaleigh. Unfortunately, the timing for starting a new business was as bad as the economy and the business failed. My husband went to school, received his CDL license, and now drives for Pegasus Transportation. I am a registered nurse and I work for Norton Healthcare.

Presently we find that our budget is very tight. My husband and I support a family of six which includes a grandson who moved from Mississippi last year to escape the drug society which is much worse than Kentucky. Also living with us is Jena's mother, who was recently released from drug rehab, and Jena's five-month-old sister who we have custody of. Having these many mouths to feed and provide for has made it increasingly difficult for us to provide the financial support that Jenaleigh needs to improve her chances of hopefully receiving a college golf scholarship.

Jena has two jobs to pay for lessons and tournaments, but it is hard for her to juggle so many responsibilities while focusing on improving for golf. We believe that she can do anything she puts her mind to` and greatly appreciate any help that you can give us on her behalf. Thank you.


