Biography

Betty Baird Kregor was born and raised in the state of Kentucky where she grew up playing golf and competing at an early age. The owner of StraightShot Inc. lives with her husband, Mark F. Kregor in Shelbyville, Ky. StraightShot Inc. College Athletic Advisors, resulted from her desire to help junior golfers and their parents in the often stressful college search. StraightShot Inc. has a 94 percent success rate in student placement and has expanded to servicing high school athletes of all sports using innovative techniques such as personality profiling, marketing packets, video and more.

Kregor is a nine-time Kentucky PGA Junior Champion, the 1974 Junior World Champion Girl's 13-14, 1976 Girl's Western National Runner-up and Girl's Western National Medalist in 1977. In 1977-79 she was a three time NJGA Junior All-American as well as an AJGA Second Team All-American and went on to play at the University of Alabama. She taught golf for over 27 years.

Kregor is a Kentucky High School Athletic Hall of Fame member and Metro Louisville Athletic Directors Hall of Fame member. She is also a member of the Board of Directors of Commonwealth Bank and Trust. Kregor is an avid American Saddlebred Horse enthusiast and loves clay shooting sports.

Betty, age 55, is married to Mark F. Kregor, Senior Vice President of Hilliard Lyons, Inc. They have four busy children, Maggie (30) who was a walk on women's golf team member for three years at University of Alabama and married to Ben Griner of Charleston, S.C.. Baird, (28) an all-conference baseball catcher for Indiana University Southeast and married to Lydia Rowe Hall of Charleston, S.C.. Mollie (20) a University of Kentucky communications graduate enjoys showing saddlebred horses and Paige (19) a junior pre-law student at the University of Kentucky.

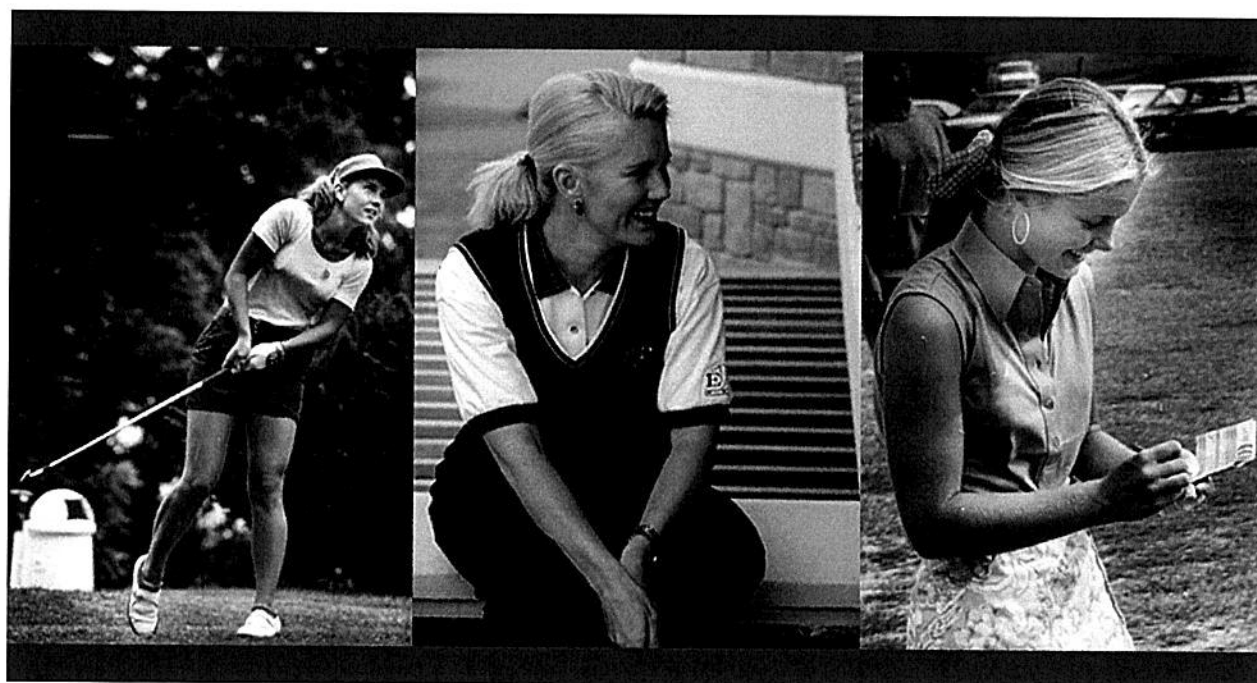

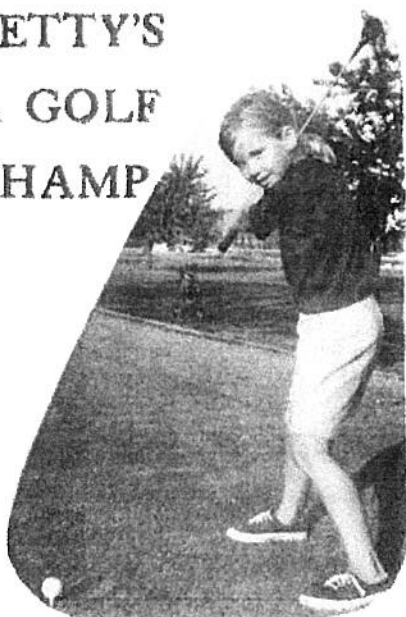

Betty Baird is too young and too small to be a caddy. Besides, she's too busy breaking golf course records herself.

The 9-year-old blonde from Louisville, Ky., may be the biggest threat to Arnold Pal-

mer and Jack Nicklaus, if they wait around long enough. And the 4-foot-6, 94-pounder says: "I get the most fun beating boys."

Betty has been whacking the ball long and straight since she was five. Recently, she toyed with her competi-

tors in the eight-nine age group in the National Pee Wee Golf Championship in Orlando, Fla.

Betty fired a 116 for 18 holes, 11 strokes better than the 24-year-old tourney's record for her age group.

And what's more amazing, Betty overcame 10 penalty shots in shattering the record.

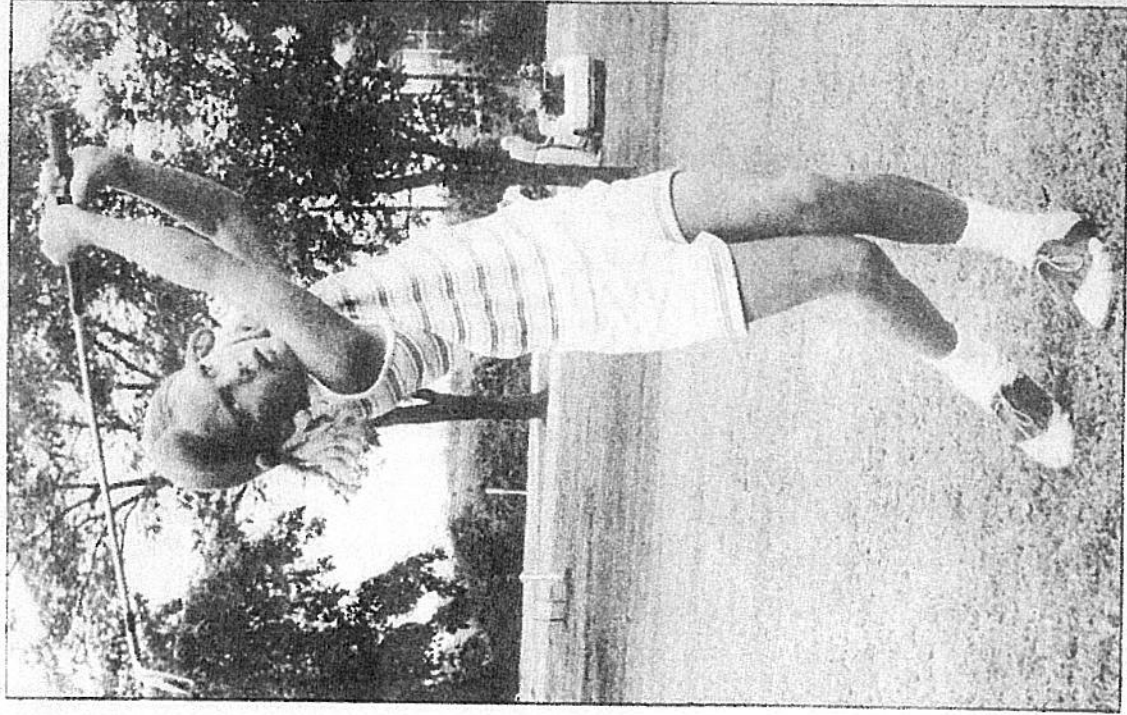
Betty got interested in the game by mocking her sister, Gee, a coed at the University of Louisville, who usually shoots in the low 80s. But now, the sisterly rivalry is dead serious.

"She'll be beating Gee by next year," said Art Leishman, the golf pro at the River Road Course near Betty's home. "I'm not kidding. She'll work that hard at it and she's that good."

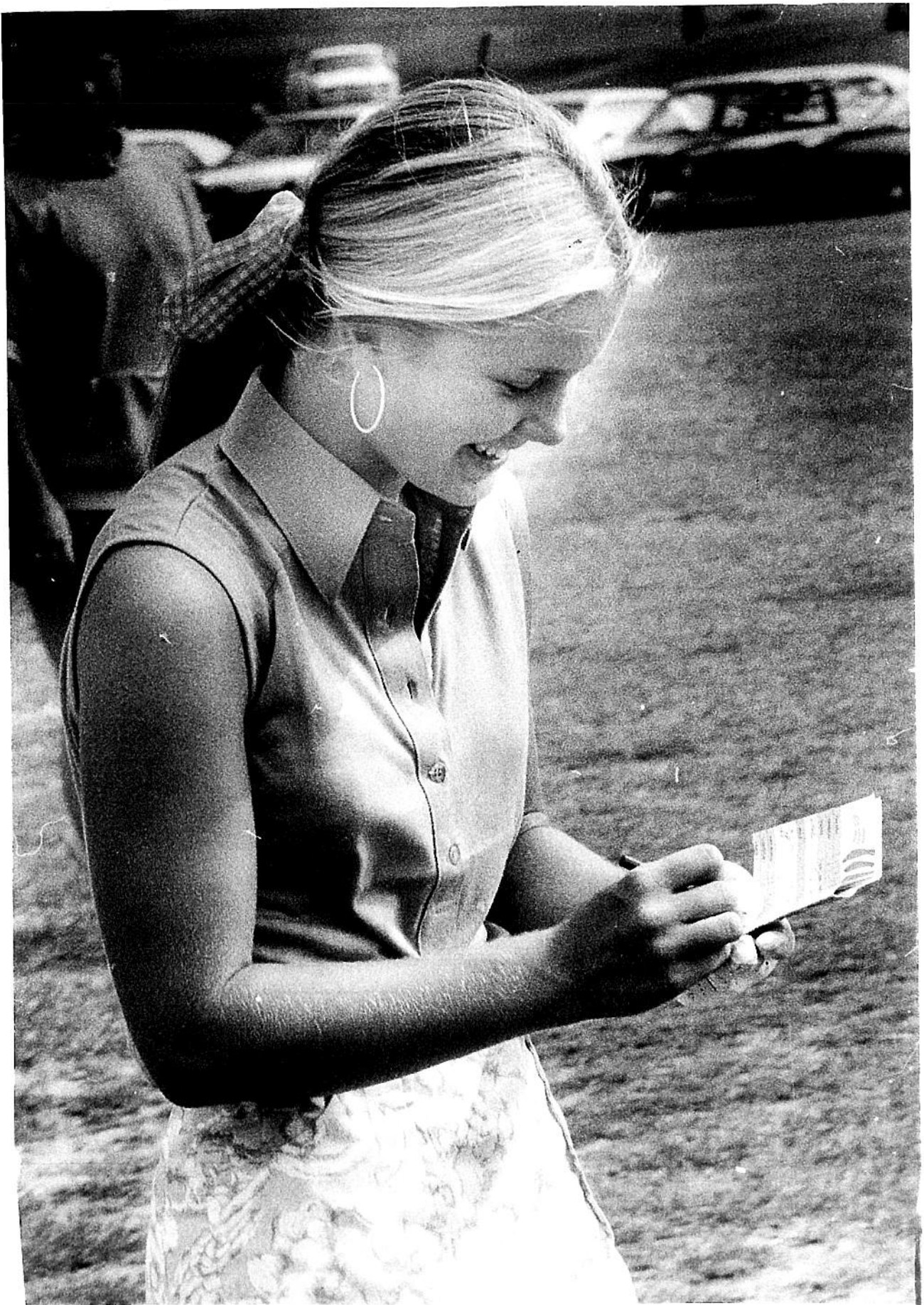
Betty says she's been serious about pursuing a golf career for the past two years. "I want to play anywhere, anytime I can," she said. "But because of my age I can't get into many tournaments."

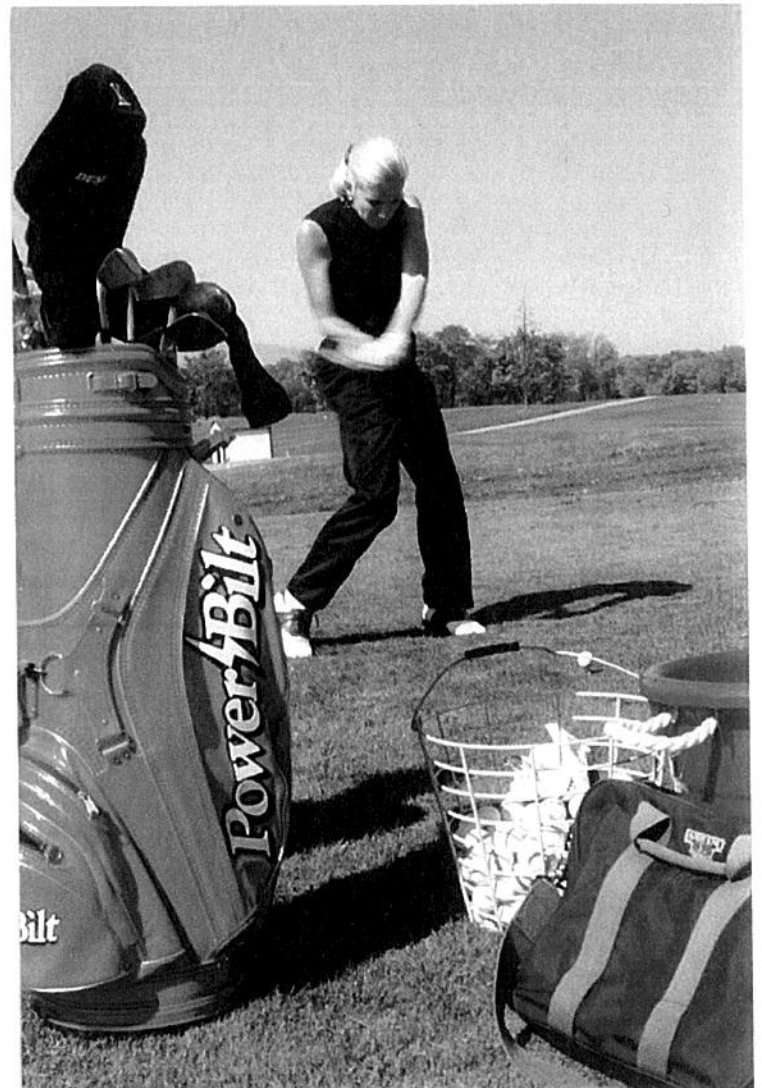

KENTUCKY GOLF LEGEND OBTAINS LPGA MASTER STATUS

Thesis Focused On The Lack of African American Female College Golfers Lands Kregor Top Award

Betty Baird Kregor, former nine-time Kentucky PGA Junior Champion and two-time All-American junior golfer, has received the highest ranking in the LPGA Teaching and Club Professional Division. Kregor joined an elite group of only 16 individuals who have earned Master Professional status within the 1,500 member LPGA teaching division. She received her award on October 6, 2013 at the LPGA Midwest Section Tournament in Columbus, Ohio, after presenting her work entitled "The Vanishing Golfer: A Study on the African American Female Junior Golfer and Knowledge of Opportunities to Play Collegiate Golf."

According to the LPGA, requirements for Master Professional certification include Class A status 10 or more years, a minimum of 300 certification units and writing a golf-related thesis with a study. "My passion for helping African American girls learn more about college golf opportunities was the driving force behind my thesis. I was disheartened to learn the number of African American female NCAA golfers has been declining in the last decade even though more girls have gotten into the game. I wanted to know why," said Kregor. She is hoping her recommendations will be seen by golf organizations around the world to help increase the number of minority female college golfers.

Kregor has been teaching golf for over 24 years, with students ranging from beginners to professional golfers. Her large junior client base resulted in another venture, StraightShot Inc., where she mentors and advises high school athletes in finding the right college fit. "I am not a recruiter, but simply a guide in the often stressful college search providing personality profiling, mentoring and support in everything from resume creating to learning to ask college coaches questions." This knowledge helped Kregor find the focus to write her thesis and hopes this recognition will create more opportunities for minority girl golfers and change the future of golf.
