The last two years I was lucky enough to be involved with the Semper Fi group which brought together wounded servicemen and servicewomen from around the country. Myself and several other instructors provided two days of teaching and coaching while the group enjoyed the practice area and golf course. This was easily a highlight having the honor to work with people who have sacrificed so greatly for our country.

3. Please describe the nominee's overall performance in teaching at the facility, Section and National level.

I feel comfortable teaching anyone at any level. They could be a raw beginner or one of the best players in the world. I believe my understanding of biomechanics, physics, motor learning, brain science, etc. has helped me wade through what works and doesn't work with a student. It gives me the opportunity to help them in a much faster way. I am so grateful that I have spent the last 10 years traveling the country, spending all of the money that I had at any given time so that I could learn from the smartest and brightest minds in several areas of expertise. Some were scientists, some were golf teachers, and some were world class players.

The education and experiences I have acquired over the years has afforded me the ability to "skin a cat" multiple ways, but get the same outcome. I had players and still teach players that are trying to make a living playing golf. My approach to each of them is often times very different. Fortunately, many of them have had success and continue to get better. As a teacher, you have to know that what works for one player, may not work for another. I believe and subscribe to this analogy: A teacher should be like a doctor. The doctor, if he's any good, should know that the medicine he gives to one patient could potentially make another patient very sick or even kill them. You have to know who to give what to and how much. This analogy guides me on the lesson tee with all of my students and has helped my overall performance immensely.

4. Please briefly describe any unusual, innovative or special teaching programs the nominee has initiated or implemented. I implemented a Long Term Athletic Development program for out junior golfers at Owl Creek Country Club. This program was designed to aid in their physical literacy and overall performance, not just in golf but in all physical activities. I learned many of these concepts while attending a TPI Junior Coach Level 2 certification. In a nutshell, the program consists of physical activities such as jumping, throwing, catching, climbing, etc. They learn how to use their bodies for physical activities, preparing them for many sports and life. This program ran for approximately 4 years and was attended by several juniors.

Also, starting in 2017, I implemented a workout program for our junior golfers at Weissinger Hills where I currently teach. The age ranges are between 12-18 for both boys and girls. It has been well received by our students as well as their parents. I believe this is due to the strength and speed they are gaining weekly. Some of these gains could potentially be attributed to a nutrition class we held back in 2017. During this class, we discussed what to eat and not eat, how much daily hydration they should be getting, and how much sleep to get daily. To keep track of their nutrition, I had them keep a nutrition and sleep journal so that I could monitor what they were doing weekly. Personally, I think many of the parents learned a few things as well about their dietary and sleep habits.

5. Please list any instructional articles, videos and/or publications the nominee has written or contributed to. I was fortunate to be one of the presenters at a Teaching Summit held at Keene Run (February 2016.) The title of my one-hour presentation was: Why Players Do What They Do. During my presentation, I discussed with the attendees what I have learned over the years while teaching and coaching my students. Also, I contributed to some content that was used by Chris Como for his Golf Channel special that will begin airing over the holidays in 2018.

6. Please list the names of outstanding golfers the nominee has instructed.

Jamie Lovemark Member of PGA Tour for multiple years. Helped him primarily at 2015 at US Open, where he finished T18.

<u>Graeme McDowell</u> Won 2010 US Open as well as multiple PGA Tour events. Started working with him in 2018.

<u>Lilly Young</u> Won the Big I tournament held at Oxmoor CC in 2017. She attends Northern Kentucky University.

She led with an 80.27 scoring average as one of only two Norse to compete in all 11 events and 26 rounds

Had two top-5 finishes on the season, placing tied-4th at the Golden Grizzlies Invitational at 10-over and tied-2nd at the Braun Intercollegiate thanks to a 4-over total in the rain-shortened affair.

Also tied for 13th at both the Horizon League Championship (24-over) and NKU Fall Classic (17-over).

Carded three of the teams 10 lowest rounds of the season.

<u>Luke McClellan</u> is a mini tour player. He won a mini tour event in his home state of South Carolina in 2017. He advanced to sectional qualifying for the US Open and also advanced to the second stage of Web.com qualifying school. Luke also gained conditional status on the Mackenzie Tour (PGA Tour Canada) in 2018.

Daniel Iceman was a member of the University of Louisville golf team. He shot -10 to get his way into a playoff for the 2016 Kentucky Open. He has qualified for the Kentucky PGA assistants championship in 2015-2018. Daniel also Monday qualified into a Mackenzie Tour event (PGA Tour Canada) in 2016. He finished 1st and 4th out of 3 PGA Winter Series events in Port St. Lucie, Florida in 2017 as well as some wins and top finishes in Kentucky Section Tournaments. In 2018, Daniel gained conditional status on the Mackenzie Tour (PGA Tour Canada) and advanced to Sectional Qualifying for the US Open. He also was the 2018 KPGA Assistant Player of the Year.

<u>Chris Malec</u> was a member of the University of Louisville golf team. He finished T6 in the first stage of Web.com Tour qualifying school in 2015 to advance to second stage. Attended Web.com Tour qualifying school in 2016 & 2017 as well. He gained conditional status on the Mackenzie Tour (PGA Tour Canada) in 2018 and won a major mini tour event in Quebec Canada.

<u>Brandon Brown</u> was a member of the Eastern Kentucky golf team. He has won several Hooters Tour events, Monday qualified into Web.com events, qualified for two PGA Tour events, qualified and played in the 2013 US Open at Merion.

<u>Yarik Merkulov</u> was a member of the Duke University golf team. He Monday qualified for a Mackenzie Tour event in 2016.

Rylee Suttor Junior golfer attending college in 2019. Won several tournaments on KYPGA Junior Golf Tour solidifying her position for KYPGA Junior Tour Player of the Year in 2018. Individually qualified for

KY State Championship in 2018 and finished T17.

7. Please describe the nominee's involvement in growing the game of golf through juniors, women, minorities, seniors and the disabled.

I was a captain for PGA Junior League teams in 2016 and 2017. I thoroughly enjoyed doing this and personally think PGA Junior League golf is making a big impact in our industry. Unfortunately, my schedule did not allow me to participate in the program in 2018 due to travel and scheduling conflicts. I look forward to participating again as a captain in 2019!

I conduct a ladies clinic on Tuesday and Thursday evenings. Most of these ladies are new to the game. We cover all areas of the game and even discuss some fitness and nutrition. They seem to enjoy the clinic very much!

Also, I have discussed doing some minority clinics and small tournaments with our General Manager in 2019. I feel this is an untapped market that should be exposed to our great game!

I have given 1,000+ lessons per year for each of the last three years; averaging 35 hours per week of lessons during peak season. I have started my own Teaching Academy/Facility (Mitchell Moore Golf Acadmey) Located at Hopkinsville CC. My students range from age 6 to 80, Professional golfers to beginners, 9 different colleges, 20+ different high/middle/grade schools, 30+ cities, and 5 different States. Golf Instruction is my passion and I enjoy living vicariously through my students success.

- 3. Please describe the nominee's overall performance in teaching at the facility, Section and National level. I, unfortunately have never been involved in instruction at the sectional or national level. This is due in large part to the fact golf instruction has always had to be "secondary" to my career as a Head Golf Professional or General Manager. It is also in large part due to the fact, I do not focus my attention on high school, college or professional golfers like the individuals who always win this award. I do not do it for notoriety. My time is spent predominantly on the everyday golfer, the ones who really help grow the game and keep our facilities alive. At ECC, we have gained (5) members in 2018, solely due to my private golf instruction. At the facility level, I have always went above and beyond history at that particular club. My first season at Tates Creek Golf Course, I did over 800 hours of golf instruction, when that facility did less than 20 hours annually for the previous (6) years. Now at Elizabethtown Country Club, I did over 1000 hours of instruction my first year, while growing junior golf numbers from 3 to over 36 participants and PGA Junior League participation from 7 players (1 team) to 20 players (2 teams). Our membership has also had it's highest retention rate ever, while our total number of members is at its peak.
- 4. Please briefly describe any unusual, innovative or special teaching programs the nominee has initiated or implemented. I think what is unusual about my methodology and approach is the fact that I am "old school" in the sense that I do not utilize launch monitors. force plates, K-vests or any of the other popular technologies. My golf academy is named "Simple Approach" for this reason. I use video with every student, but focus the majority of my time on fundamentals and "negative feedback" drills that have always yielded the best results for me. I always try to have my students leave with more questions answered, versus the common issue today in which students are overloaded and leave with more questions than answers. In today's age, there is too much technical "coach-speak" and only the most advanced students can interpret and improve with this amount of technology and confusing terminology. I firmly believe our industry loses a lot of golfers due to poor instructional experiences and pupil frustration. Nobody likes to participate in things they are not good at or don't understand. A lot of instructors inadvertently make students feel inferior because of the way they verbalize things and their methodology.

- 5. Please list any instructional articles, videos and/or publications the nominee has written or contributed to.

 Again, since I cater to the golfers who I feel make the biggest impact on our game, the "everyday" player or average golfer, I have never contributed to any of these public communication channels. I like to spend my time outside of the lesson tee, answering instructional questions for members or offering advice to beginners and juniors.
- 6. Please list the names of outstanding golfers the nominee has instructed. A former student of mine for five years when I resided in Louisville (John Marshall Butler) just won the KHSAA State Title although he is not currently my student. But again, outside of that, most of my students are winning club championships and various other club and local events. I had over (20) students break their personal bests this season and numerous junior golfers win local events and earn their highest finishes ever.
 - 1) Grant Manion (Grayson County HS) broke 80 in multiple high school/junior events after never breaking 90 in a competitive round. Average score in 2017 was in the mid-90's.
 - 2) Paige Gray (Central Hardin HS) Broke her personal best (3) separate times this season, while shooting 80 and tying for 1st place in the regional tournament. Her average score was in the mid-90's in 2017.
 - 3) Chase Childress (Larue County HS) Broke his personal best multiple times this season, while shooting a 78 (new personal best) and finishing in 4th place in the region tournament. His average score was in the high 90's in 2017.
 - 4) Katie Gray (Central Hardin HS) Broke her personal best this season, while shooting 89 her first event of the year and winning the KY PGA Junior event at Elizabethtown CC. Her average score was over 100 last season.
- 7. Please describe the nominee's involvement in growing the game of golf through juniors, women, minorities, seniors and the disabled. Junior and women's golf have always been very important to me, as I feel that they are the biggest determining factors of longevity of our game. I am a US Kids Certified Instructor and have grown the junior programs at every facility I have been at. While at Louisville CC, I assisted in growing the junior golf program from 25 players to over 50 when I left. Now at Elizabethtown CC, I offer (2) junior golf camps and had (2) PGA Junior League teams. Prior to my arrival at ECC, there were (3) kids who participated in each camp, while I had 16 and 20, respectively. My PGA

Junior League had (10) kids on each team for a total of (20) participants, prior to that only (6) kids participated. I also give private lessons to high school students from every local high school: Central Hardin, North Hardin, Elizabethtown and Larue County. I also spend a lot of my free time around the practice tee and short game areas lending a hand to any junior golfers who may need help.

As far as ladies golf goes, while at Tates Creek in Lexington, I taught approximately half of the Fayette Women's Golf Association and offered numerous camps and clinics for these women. At Elizabethtown CC, we only had (8) ladies who actively played and now we have (16). I give lessons to half of these ladies. I offer a Wine Down Wednesday clinic and game in which I give a short clinic and then send the ladies out for a 9-hole game and they eat at the clubhouse after. I also offer "Short Game Schools" to the novice and above ladies and Beginner Clinics to those members who may simply have spouses that play, but do not play themselves.

Without juniors or ladies entering and being retained in the game, the golf industry will never see a large incline in participation. These two areas are vital to the growth of our game.

3. Please describe the nominee's overall performance in teaching at the facility, Section and National level.

As Director of Player Development at The Golf Academy @ Persimmon Ridge, my responsibilities include introducing new golfers to the game, continuing to help established golfers improve, and always looking for new ways to make the game easier for our players. In the Kentucky Section, I strive to be a positive role model by conducting myself in a professional manner, being a constant face at educational opportunities, and encouraging assistants, apprentices, and PGM students to reach out for learning opportunities.

Thanks to Persimmon Ridge and our indoor training facility, I have the ability to teach 12 months a year. In the summer, we stay busy with 3-5 week-long PGA Junior Golf Camps where we host up to 20 juniors a week for half/full day instruction. In 2016, 2017, and 2018 we coached St. Patrick's MS team which included more than 90 players/year, St. Aloyisius program with 20 players, hosted a MS developmental weekly clinic for more than 40 players, fielded 3 or more PGA Junior League Teams yearly, conducted weekly Saturday Junior clinics at Persimmon Ridge and King Louie's Sports Complex, worked with over 20 college and professional athletes, and have grown to nearly 100 middle school and high school golfers that we see weekly for group training and individual instruction.

I am always looking for ways to improve and be the best possible coach for our players. To me, this includes both growth and learning in the field of golf and also personal growth. On the side of golf, I have traveled to New Jersey to achieve a certification in BioSwing Dynamics under the tutelage of my mentor Mike Adams, spent a weekend in Richmond, VA shadowing the junior golf program at Independence Golf Club, one that

sees over 3,000 juniors each year, gone through multiple online certification programs, completed the Vision 54 "Be A Player" program and Lynn and Pia's in 3-day Coaching for the Future, and joined top instructor Will Robins and his team of RGX. In my opinion, the greatest personal challenge I have found is Ryan Moran's 10 Day Challenge. Completing this has led to my desire to continue to learn more about myself and how I can best serve others. I have found that audiobooks and podcasts from mental coaches/life strategists like Tim Ferris, Tony Robbins, Dr. Bhrett McCabe, Dr. Robb Bell, and many more have improved my coaching as much as, if not more than, golf specific learning.

Every Spring, I volunteer at the Louisville Golf Expo PGA Free Lesson booth and speaks on the main stage as a keynote speaker. I continue to reach out to fellow PGA Professionals for guidance and education in order to provide my students the best possible product I can offer. In the Spring of 2018 I had the opportunity to speak to EKU PGM students during their teaching and coaching class.

4. Please briefly describe any unusual, innovative or special teaching programs the nominee has initiated or implemented.

I have implemented the following programs at Persimmon Ridge:

- The Littlest Golfer (Juniors ages 3-5)
- Weekly Junior Clinics (ages 6-13)
- MS/HS Player Program
- Vision 54 Training (4 hour clinic)
- 1-week long Junior Camps
- Supervised Practice- 1 ½ hours a week where each student would receive Colby's "Perfect Practice" program and work together in a group practice session.
- Course Management Clinics
- AimPoint Green Reading Clinics
- Short Game Golf Schools
- Adult 1-day Golf Schools
- Corporate Golf Schools
- TrackMan yardage gapping sessions- 1-2 hours of hitting balls on TrackMan with each club. Clubs would be altered/fit as needed to create the desired carry yardages for each club.
- SAM Putt Lab sessions- Students would go through an initial measurement and extended training using SAM Putt Lab.

By far the most innovative and effective program we have created is our Committed/Elite program which includes weekly group practices and individual training. Due to its nature as a yearlong program, we are able to tailor the practice schedule to fit the time of year. In the off season (October-January) we focus on club head speed, body pivots, drivers, and TrackMan education. Our juniors have averaged an increase of 2.8 mph/month utilizing our speed training routine. As we get closer to the season, we transition into wedges and putting as well as starting to focus on course management techniques and Vision 54 training. Once back outside, we get into tournament/practice routines, tons of short game, on course training, and dispersions. Once in tournament season, the foundation is set and our focus shifts to making sure all of our players are tournament ready while making minor adjustments to fundamentals as needed but staying focused on short game, course management, process, and feel. In 2017 players from this program combined for more than 60 tournament wins and over 100 top 5 finishes.

I always relish the chance to be on course with our players...especially during tournaments. I especially enjoy when I have the chance to caddy for players in tournaments. As a caddy, I am very good at taking the emotions out of decision making and helping the player make the appropriate decisions for themselves. As a result, most of the players I caddy for shoot career tournament lows while I am with them. Below are a few players who played great while I caddied for them:

Turin Duber, 10: -2 9-hole event at Seneca. Won by 4
Emily Warner, 15: 3rd Place Hurricane Tour Major
Frankie Morgan, 19: Nearly qualified for the Barbasol championship after a 32 on his front 9.
Peyton Bonny, 14: Made cut at KY State Am

Be best part of being on the course with our players is after the event when we can take the time to look at places we can improve.

In the summer of 2017 I began using dispersions to help our high school and college players manage their tee shots for tournament rounds. I would use TrackMan to get a players dispersions and carry distances and create a course map for them using Google Earth. This would give players a start line and club selection based on their dispersions and tendencies for each tee shot they would play. Over the past two years, I have made course maps for players at St. Xavier, Trinity, KCD, Floyd Centeral, University of Kentucky, Indiana University, Dayton, Cincinnati, Moorhead State, Ball State, Bellarmine, and professionals compete on the Mackenzie Tour, Web.com tour and PGA Tour. Players using the course maps averaged 2-3 more

fairways a round and more importantly dropped their scoring average by 1-2 strokes a round. Cooper Musselman used the course maps for this entire season at UK including an individual win at Crooked Stick which propelled him to #33 in the country and through all stages of web.com q-school qualifying in 2018.

I have written semi-monthly articles for Southern Gaming Magazine of Indiana as well as shooting 3-5 instructional videos a year with Inside Kentucky Golf. In the Spring of 2015, I published "Learn to Play Golf: A quick and easy guide, from tee to green" on Amazon Kindle.

7. Please describe the nominee's involvement in growing the game of golf through juniors, women, minorities, seniors and the disabled.

I have served on the Player Development Committee for 5 years including chairing the committee for 2 years. The following are programs that we have implemented to continue to grow the game.

Get Golf Ready/Beginning Ladies Clinics- Our GGR program has transformed into weekly beginning ladies clinics for those that wanted to continue playing after the 5 week program.

Golf in Schools- Last Winter/Spring, I visited 6 different elementary schools with his Golf in Schools Program. He visited each school for 1-2 weeks with the attempt of seeing every student (K-6th grade) at least once. Since its inception Colby has reached over 3,000 kids.

Drive, Chip, and Putt- To coincide with the national program, I started a DCP Training series at Persimmon Ridge to help prepare his juniors for their

competition. In its second year, the program reached over 20 juniors. 8 juniors made it through the local qualifying stage.

PGA Junior League Golf- In its fourth season at Persimmon Ridge, PGA JLG boasted 45 participants. I was able to create 3 travel teams: 2 Varsity and 1 JV. The JV team consisted of 10-12 juniors that were newer to the game. We continued a Fall league for those that wanted to stay with us and had nearly 20 players. We have since transitioned indoors for winter PGA JLG training and have 16 players still participating weekly.

Junior Camps- In 2018 Colby directed the following Junior Camps:

PGA Junior Golf Camps- 3 camps conducted reaching 50 juniors. Camps ran Monday-Friday and juniors had the choice to participate in either a half day or full day camp.

Weekly Junior Camps- We conduct weekly one-day junior camps year round. These camps totaled over 200 students taught.

EWGA Clinics- Colby offered 2x 5-week clinic series' for the EWGA with a total of 12 women participants.

Louisville Golf Expo- I volunteer yearly at the KPGA Free Lesson booth at the Spring Golf Expo as well as speak on the main stage.

St. Patrick Middle School Team- For the past three years, we have coached the Middle School team at St. Patrick School. The team consists of nearly 90 juniors yearly that meet twice a week during the season. I coordinated with 6-8 other coaches working on athletic development, short game skills, on course learning, full swing, and of course fun games weekly.

The Littlest Golfer- The Littlest golfer consisted of a group of golfers ages 3-5. The program utilized the book "Let's Play Golf" by Nicole Weller and The Littlest Golfer sets were provided to those that did not have their own clubs. I am a certified "Little Golf Train Conductor" which specialized in working with kids in this age range.

Juvenile Detention Center- I began visiting a local juvenile detention center with SNAG equipment in the winter of 2016. The goal is to provide an incentive for the kids to set goals and stay focused on getting their work done. I print out a goals sheet for each participant. In order to get to do golf the next week, they had to come up with a list of goals as well as steps to achieve them. They also needed to get all of their work done and be on good behavior. 100% of the juniors still at the facility the following weeks succeeded in both of these areas.

Semper Fi- In 2017 I spent 2 days working with wounded veterans through a golf school offered to them at U of L Golf Club. I have also been through the PGA Hope certification.
